

# Parsonage Farm Primary School

## PE and Sport Grant - 2023-2024

### **Introduction**

The direct funding for school sport, which was announced by the Government in 2013, provides money directly to Primary Schools to fund improvements to the provision of PE and sport. It is also supportive in helping to build a healthy lifestyle, confidence and a sense of achievement.

The allocation for Parsonage Farm is £20,888

It is for schools to decide how the PE & Sports Grant is spent, since they are best placed to assess what additional provision should be made.

### **Use of Funding**

At Parsonage Farm, the funding will be used for:

1. Membership of the Havering Sports Collective, which includes:
  - Staff Training tailored to suit our school
  - Participation in a vast variety of external competitions (both KS1 and KS2)
  - Termly Conferences for PE lead and PE teaching assistant
  - Training of our new School Games Crew (Sports Leaders)
  - Opportunities to visit other Collective Schools
  - Support with the PE quality mark
2. Support with swimming lessons
3. New equipment to enable us to offer a greater variety of After School Clubs
4. New equipment to support PE lessons and activities
5. PE Teaching Assistant/Coach (3.5 hours per day)
6. Transport to and from external competitions which take place in school time
7. Internal Tournaments & Events (e.g. Table Tennis & Golden Mile)
8. Release of PE teacher to attend Festivals and Competitions

### **The effect of the previous year's funding on pupil's participation and attainment**

- Thanks to our ongoing commitment in PE and Sports we were awarded the Platinum School Games Mark. As a school, we were successful in winning the Havering Rugby Tournament, the Table Tennis Tournament and the Havering Cricket Tournament. One of our Year 4 girls was the overall Quadkids winner for her age group across the whole of Havering. In addition, we reached the final of the Girls Football League.
- A number of competitions for children with SEND were run by the Havering Collective and we entered children into these.
- Children participated in the annual Golden Mile and sprint competitions as well as the table tennis tournament for Years 5 and 6.
- 67% of our Year 6 children were successfully able to swim 25 metres.

### **How we will make sure these improvements are sustainable**

- We are continuing to sustain the profile of PE across the whole school through continued funding of the area above and beyond the PE sports funding
- We have a PE team consisting of two PE leaders and a PE Teaching Assistant demonstrating the importance we place on this subject
- Through the Havering Collective we are receiving specialist PE support which teachers are then using to aid their own professional development and to engage more children in a range of PE activities
